TO VOTE IN NEBRASKA

✓ You must be a United States citizen.

You must be 18 years of age or older on General Election Day.

 You must be a resident of Nebraska.

VOTING ACCOMMODATIONS

All polling places in Nebraska must be accessible to voters with disabilities.

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HOW TO REGISTER

Register by Mail or In Person Request a Voter Registration form through your local County Clerk's office.

Visit our website for links to:

- Register online.
- Print a registration form.
- Learn how to get a free state ID card.

Here's a list of all the types of identification that will be accepted for voting:

- Nebraska driver's license/state ID
- U.S. passport, military ID, tribal ID
- Hospital, assisted-living facility or nursing home record
- Nebraska political subdivision ID (state, county, city, school, etc.)
 - Nebraska college or university ID

MAKE SURE YOUR VOICE IS HEARD

Lawmakers pay attention to people who vote in their districts.

- Nobody can tell you how to vote.
- Vote for issues you care about.
- Vote for candidates who support issues that matter to you.

QUICK VOTING FACTS

✓ If you have a Guardian...

People with a Guardian, Payee, or Conservator can still vote unless a judge has specifically taken that right away.

\checkmark You can ask for help.

You can vote by yourself or with help from a friend, family member, or polling place worker.

✓ Voting is free.

It does not cost anything to vote or to register to vote.

\checkmark Vote by mail or in person.

You can complete your ballot at home and mail it in OR go to your polling place to vote.

If you have been convicted of a felony...

You can register to vote if you've finished your sentence or parole.

You will need to show photo ID to vote. You can get a free state ID cord

You can get a free state ID card.

\checkmark If you live in a facility...

People who live in group homes and facilities have a right to vote!
